

When you think of famous alpine countries, your mind may conjure images of France and Switzerland before Italy. But Italy contains a greater share of the Alps' total area than both of its neighbours. It's home to 27.2% of the range, a figure only beaten by Austria with 28.7%. The Italian Alps' crown jewel, the Dolomites, possesses such beauty that they even hold the status of a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
