Snowdonia is best known for Snowdon, the highest mountain in Wales, which rises to an elevation of 1,085 meters. The mountain and the surrounding peaks offer some of the best hillwalking and mountaineering opportunities in Wales, as well as breathtaking views of the surrounding landscapes.
